**HKTV's Testing Videos for Mobile Reception of Terrestrial TV Signal Made Public
Seeing is Believing - HKTV Urges the Government for Fair Treatment**

(Hong Kong, 27 March 2014) In view of the Government's reluctance to face the reality, Hong Kong Television Network Limited ("HKTV") would like to reiterate the following 3 points :

1. HKTV is acting according to the terms & conditions that were stated on the licence, including the provision of mobile TV service for viewing on mobile devices, and any apparatus using the technology of a mobile station for a mobile customers but being installed at a fixed location. Mobile TV service is not limited to TV service received at outdoor locations.
2. In reality, if all Inbuilding Coaxial Cable Distribution Systems are equipped with filter, illegal reception of signals other than terrestrial TV & sound signals can be prohibited. No matter which standard HKTV chooses, the signals would not be available for reception at all specified premises.
3. Miss Eliza Lee, Director-General of Communications has said that, "We would rather face the comments of being rigid and bureaucratic, instead of being blamed for failure of adhering to the law and fairness, as these are severe accusations." The reality is that, terrestrial TV signals of TVB and ATV are available for reception smoothly on mobile device.

OFCA has also mentioned in its press release that "Under the TO, section 8(1)(aa) stipulates that save under and in accordance with a licence granted there under, no person shall in Hong Kong offer in the course of business a telecommunications service." TVB and ATV are licensees of Domestic Free TV Program Service, that their signals are available for reception by the public for free. The concepts of "offer in the course of business", service arrangements and agreements do not really exist and applicable, and OFCA's views cannot stand.

In view of this, HKTV launched those 27 testing videos for reception of terrestrial

TV signals with mobile device on YouTube, to invite the public for making their own judgment on whether these TV stations are providing mobile TV service :
